

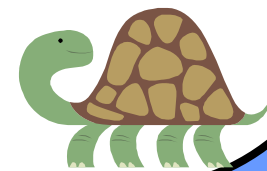
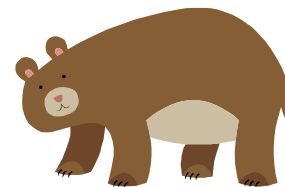
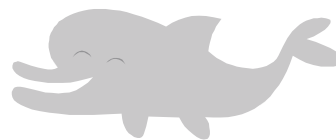


Go Wild!

Year 7 students are responsible for creating a **presentation** about endangered animals.

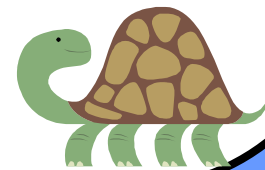
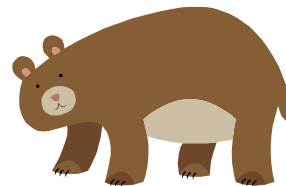
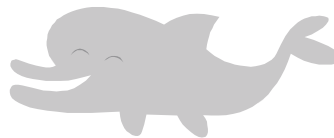
The **target audience** for the presentation is also year 7 pupils. Therefore it is important for the students to consider how to make their presentation attractive to this age group.

This resource provides an example of work produced by our pupils, with commentary indicating the **National Curriculum assessment level** criteria that it meets.



Tasks

1. Pupils must **plan** their multimedia presentation, considering its appearance (including font colour & type, layout, background colours & fills, auto shapes used, navigational hyperlinks, WordArt, images etc).
2. Pupils create their **first draft** multimedia presentation.
3. Pupils **evaluate** their own work & peer assess other pupils' work
4. Pupils make **improvements** to their design based upon areas identified in evaluations
5. Finally students **annotate** their work, providing labels to justify their design decisions

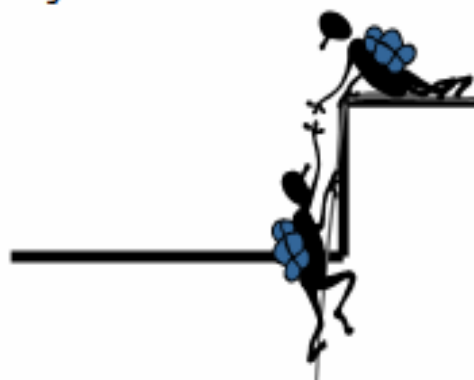


Multimedia Presentation Design LEVEL 6
